#### Giving Opportunities

We are currently raising money to dig a well in Haiti. The village La Roche which means The Rock is about an hour outside of Port-au-Prince. The closest well to the village is an hour walk down the mountain. The women of the village make this walk each evening to secure water for their families. Several wells are needed in the area because the population is around 6,000 people. The cost of each well is \$3,500. Please do what ever you can.
